

City Council Meeting

October 13, 2014

The regular Riverdale City Council meeting of October 13, 2014 was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Schulz.

Present: Marc Schulz, Ken Skuza, Nita Anderson, Nancy Elliott and Auditor Del Kolke

Elliott moved to approve the September 8, 2014 regular meeting minutes and budget meeting minutes of September 8, 2014 and October 6, 2014. Skuza seconded. Motion carried.

Skuza moved to approve the bills. Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Elliott moved to approve the agenda. Skuza seconded. Motion carried.

Guests:

Based on a written request from the Riverdale Ambulance Service indicating a larger transformer is necessary for the current Emergency Services building and temporary housing facility, the City agreed to pay for half of the transformer.

Reports:

Auditor reported November 1 will be the last Saturday opening of the landfill for 2014 with access on Wednesdays continuing as weather permits.

Old Business:

Anderson moved to address special assessment item tabled at September 8, 2014 meeting. Skuza seconded. Motion carried. Anderson moved to levy special assessments for services on parcels presented by City Auditor. Elliott seconded. Roll Call: Skuza aye, Anderson aye, Elliott aye. Motion carried.

New Business:

Skuza moved to designate the City Hall meeting room as the polling site for the special city election to fill a vacant council seat. Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Anderson moved to appoint Monica Liebel, clerk; Karen Fitzpatrick, inspector; and Wanda Schaffer, judge to service as the election board for the special city election. Elliott seconded. Motion carried.

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Portfolio Reports:

Skuzza informed council the city blade is being repaired and a contractor will be continuing work on the John Adams road project.

Anderson announced Terry & Marlene Martin will not be serving as campground hosts next season. Martins were commended for their management of the facility. New managers will be Terry & Kim Morast, site 83. The tree planting project at the campground has been completed as well as relocation of evergreen trees to that area. Appreciation was extended to Marc Schulz, youth work crew and fire department for their assistance. Remaining maintenance items include picnic table inspection/repair and placing gravel on roads within the campground.

Elliott reported Electrical Services has completed their portion of the John Adams project.
